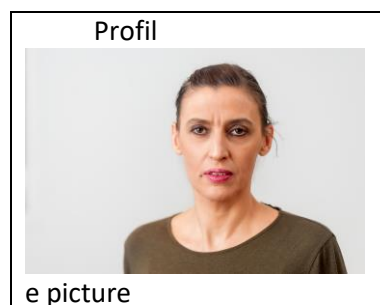

Short Biography (up to 200 words): Vanja Savic completed undergraduate studies at the University of Belgrade in English Language and Literature. She went on to obtain MPhil in Contemporary Literary Theory in 2011. In the meantime, she spent a year abroad completing an M.A. program in European Studies called Euromasters offered by the University of Bath and partner universities. Two semesters of the study of EU policymaking and specific EU policies (energy, environment, enlargement) were completed at Humboldt and Freie universities in Berlin in German, and two semesters tackling more theoretical issues (theories of European integration, comparative politics, social movements) and writing an MA dissertation on social movements in old and new democracies were completed in English. She was awarded an M.A. in European Studies in 2009. Working with various organizations and institutions in Serbia and Germany and independently presenting at international conferences, she finally enrolled a PhD in Politics program at King's College London in 2019. Works part-time for the IHS Markit/S&P (Standard & Poor's) as an OSINT event collector since 2020.
